

## APPENDIX III

### GLOSSARY

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- Achkan - a gored knee or calf length coat with front opening and buttoned from neck to waist. A lappet binds on inside is sometimes attached to one of the flaps of its skirt.
- Angarkha - it is a long upper garment worn by men. It is tied in the front on left side and has long fitted sleeves.
- Angarkhi - it is like <sup>Angarkha</sup> but short in length, i.e. upto hip or slightly below the hips. It has two parts bodice and skirt.
- Bandi - A vest with half sleeves. It is fastened at the chest level by means of cloth hooks and eyelets or buttoned in the front sometimes pocket in the front. In local language it is called Banyan.
- Bhoto - It is a double breasted tight fitted upper garment of Napali male. It has lining.
- Chaubandi - Double breasted waist or hip length upper garment of Napali man. It is tight fitted at waist and fastened inside and outside at shoulders and waist.
- Choga - a long robe mainly worn by high class males.
- Cholo or Misalen - It is a double breasted close fitted waist length blouse with full sleeves. It is worn by Napali women.
- Chooridar Pyjama - A trousers worn by men and it is tight from knee to ankle level and loose above the knee. The extra length is gathered up in folds at ankle called chooris.
- Daura - Upper garment worn by Napali men.
- Dhoti - Draped lower garment of men. Draping style varies from place to place.
- Dupatta - Rectangular piece of fabric used as a wrapper to cover the head and shoulders. Also termed as Odhani.

- Ghagra - A gathered ankle or calf length skirt. This is also known as Lehanga.
- Pagari - A ready to wear headgear, 3-10 yards in length.
- Patka - A waist band wrapped around the waist.
- Patuka - A piece of cloth wrapped around the waist at the time of funeral procession by Napali men.
- Sadri - A sleeved or sleeveless front buttoned short jacket worn by men.
- Salwar - A loose baggy bifurcated ankle length garment tied with string at waist.
- Izar - A lower bifurcated garment, tied at waist and worn by men.
- Jhaggi - A upper garment with or without sleeves worn over another garment shirt or kurta. Its length is upto waist or hip level.
- Kapdu - A cotton multicoloured upper garment of Gujarati female. It is backless tight fitted blouse with a deep V or U neckline.
- Khasto or Dolai - It is a shawl 3 meter long and 36 to 50 inches wide worn around the shoulder by both male and female from Nepal.
- Suruwal - Loose trousers worn by female and tied at waist with a string.
- Topi - Ready to wear head dress of men made in various shapes and design.
- Dastar - It is a head dress worn under the turban mostly by baptised Sikh males.
- Patka - is a small square piece of cloth worn on head by young Sikh boys.
