DIRECTIONS FOR SUBJECTS 8 YEARS AND ABOVE

- * Use design A
- Point to the row of stars, squares, etc. and say: "Look at these and see how each one has some mark inside. Now look at these samples and I want you to put in each figure the same mark that you fin here in the top row. Here is a star so put this mark inside." After marking the first two or three samples let the subject fill in the remaining and then start timing when the samples have been finished.
- * Time limit 120"

- Use design B and point to the key and say: "Look at these boxes and squares. See how each has a number in the upper half and a mark in the lower half. Each number has its own special mark. Now look at the samples. Here is a 2, so put in this mark (here write the symbol) and try the others until I tell you to stop." Start timing when the samples have been completed. Watch out that the subject does not skip any.
- * Time limit 120"
- For left handed subjects an extra folded code so that they do not obscure their vision.
