•	Borderless	Idea of Borderless Democracy suggests a model of deliberative
	Democracy	democracy where different groups are able to negotiate their claims and
		beliefs. Such model specifically ensures that even those groups and
		individuals are able to participate in the deliberative processes which are
		hitherto pushed beyond the territory of public deliberations.
•	Out of Bounds	Idea of out of bounds is a conceptual tool which refers to such groups
		which are outcasted from the domain of deliberation by the
		conventional discourse. The concerns of such groups are never
		considered as the legitimate subject of deliberation.
•	Coerced Invisibility	Coerced invisibility is the spatial impact of out of bounds position of
		some groups whose claims are ignored and suppressed. Due to such
		suppression their existence become invisible and insignificant to the
		conventional discourse.
•	Trichotomy of	It is a conceptual tool proposed to better understand the underexplored
	Public-Private-	are of individuality which often suffers under the aggrandizing
	Personal	interpretation of the conventional public-private dichotomy.
•	Personal Sphere	Personal sphere refers to that sphere of individuality where the
		restraints of the society does not matter and individual is free to feel or
		think. It can be understood as an innate sphere of self-expression from
		where a feeling of self-worth emerges.
•	Top-Down Reform	It is a conceptual tool used to understand the flow of systemic reform
		from the state structures which eventually flows to the society and kick
		starts a continuum of reform.
•	Equality as	Equality as renegotiation can be understood as an on-going process
	Renegotiation	where different groups deliberate together around the ideals of equality
		and liberty to carve an autonomous sphere for themselves while also
		ensuring that such autonomy does not infringe upon the autonomy of
		others.
