

<i>Glossary</i>	
<i>Akal takht</i>	Seat of Sikh Leadership
<i>Anga</i>	A short double breasted garment, usually tied with knots, around neck, chest and waist.
<i>Angrakha</i>	A long double breasted garment, usually tied with knots, around neck, chest and waist.
<i>Bagh</i>	Garden like, densely embroidered phulkari, with no or very less ground fabric visible.
<i>Bahawalpuri</i>	Wide baggy salwar with voluminous folds
<i>Bebe</i>	Mother
<i>Bibi</i>	Elder Sister
<i>Behairi</i>	Festival celebrated by mother and children in Punjab
<i>Bhangra</i>	Dance form of Punjab
<i>Candtaka</i>	Men's half trousers in Gupta Period
<i>Chakki</i>	Stone made flour mill used to grind grains and millets for domestic use
<i>Chalda Taropa</i>	Running Stich
<i>Charpoy</i>	A day bed made by weaving cord around wooden frame
<i>Chaupad</i>	Board game similar to chess

<i>Chola</i>	Front open long garment worn by men and women
<i>Choga</i>	Full sleeved skirted cloke, tied at waist
<i>Deli</i>	Entrance point of house
<i>Dholki</i>	A musical instrument like drum
<i>Diwa</i>	Oil Lamp
<i>Do rukha</i>	Double sided
<i>Durrie</i>	Handwoven cotton rug
<i>Gana</i>	A scared thread in red colour decorated with cowrie shells, mirrors, metal bells; tied on wrists to repel evil eye
<i>Ghaghra</i>	A flaired skirt worn by women
<i>Ghaire</i>	Flair of garment
<i>Ghumki</i>	Dangling earrings usually in shape of umbrella
<i>Ghuttana</i>	Type of short length payjama, loose at thighs and fitted around knees
<i>Goliani</i>	Women hawker, belonging to nomadic tribe
<i>Gota</i>	Shiny lace like decoration for garments
<i>Gunn</i>	Qualities

<i>Gul</i>	Persian word for flower
<i>Gur</i>	Jaggery
<i>Guttiyan</i>	Small skeins of embroidery threads
<i>Hookah</i>	Smoke Pipe
<i>Jaal</i>	Allover pattern of floral design
<i>Jaap</i>	Chanting God's name
<i>Janjir taropa</i>	Chain Stich
<i>Jhumar</i>	Chandelier
<i>Jora-jama</i>	Set of Garments given to the groom and bride
<i>Julaha</i>	Weaver
<i>Jutti</i>	Traditional flat shoes from Punjab
<i>Kaccha taropa</i>	Uneven darning stitch
<i>Kalava</i>	A scared thread in red colour decorated with cowrie shells, mirrors, metal bells; tied on wrists to repel evil eye
<i>Kameez</i>	A straight cut knee length kurta worn by women, usually without side slits
<i>Kancha</i>	A trouser similar to the pantaloons

<i>Kari</i>	Work
<i>Karue</i>	A festival celebrated by newly married woman at in-laws house
<i>Kikkar</i>	Gum arabic tree, with acacia flowers
<i>Kuber</i>	God of Wealth
<i>Kurta</i>	Straight cut long garment with side slits, worn by men and women
<i>Kurtaka</i>	Short shirt with extended full sleeves from the shoulder, a garment worn by women
<i>Kurti</i>	Shirt for women
<i>Kut</i>	Iron
<i>Laccha</i>	Lower draped garment worn by men and women
<i>Lacchiyaan</i>	Small skeins of embroidery threads
<i>Lohri</i>	Festival that marks passing of the winter solstice
<i>Lugodi</i>	A draped textiles used by women
<i>Macchi taropa</i>	Herringbone Stitch
<i>Mukhtsari pajama</i>	A straight cut payjama from Muktsar region
<i>Nada</i>	Chord used to fastion the lower garment like salwar, skirt and payjama

<i>Nathni</i>	Nose ring
<i>Nazar battu or najar battu</i>	Small motif usually embroidered in a contrast colour to catch the attention of eye and assit to repel evil-eye
<i>Palki sahib</i>	The main structure that houses Guru Granth Sahib the holy book of Sikhs
<i>Pat</i>	Silk floss
<i>Peshwaj</i>	A loose coat
<i>Phera</i>	The sacred rounds around fire in Hindu marriage and around Guru Granth Sahib in Sikh marriages
<i>Pola taropa</i>	Uneven darning stitch
<i>Poncha</i>	A thick band reinforced to the hem of a salwar or trouser
<i>Phulkari</i>	A shawl or a head cover, lightly embroidered with silk floss with floral motifs spangled in the field with no visible stitches at the reverse side of fabric
<i>Punja</i>	A comb like device used to beat weft while weaving
<i>Payjama</i>	A straight cut lower garment worn with kurta
<i>Rani haar</i>	An eleborate neck ornament
<i>Salari</i>	A local term for phulkari in Hazara
<i>Saluka</i>	A narrow waist coat worn by men in Sindh
<i>Salwar</i>	A loose lower garment worn by men and women

<i>Sammi</i>	A dance form from Punjab
<i>Saraiki</i>	A flaired version salwar
<i>Sassi</i>	Local term for cotton
<i>Shuja khani</i>	Varities of blended fabric
<i>Sirga</i>	A local term for phulkari in Hazara
<i>Sucha</i>	Literally means pure, locally used for silk
<i>Sufi</i>	Muslim religious preacher
<i>Sut</i>	Hand-spun cotton thread
<i>Suthan</i>	A lower garment similar to salwar
<i>Svasthana</i>	A type of lower garment similar to trouser
<i>Tamba Tehmat</i>	Lower draped garment worn by men and women
<i>Thaap</i>	Hand gesture to denote the beat of a musical instrument
<i>Tij</i>	Festival celebrated by women in Punjab and various part of North India
<i>Trijan or Trinjan</i>	A gathering of women to collectively work on crafts
<i>Varbena</i>	A kurta without side slits

<i>Veranda</i>	Sitting area in house
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
