A note on the titles of CP.

CP has declared his own titles which he obtained by performing several stauta and grhya sacrifices. He is also an erudite scholar in this branch. Herebelow his titles are explained.

- Agnicit is a person who has offered Agnicayana which is a rite of piling the fire-altar, included in the Soma sacrifices, in 5 layers with bricks, on the uttarayed for setting up the ahavaniya; it is represented in SBr. as a human imitation of the construction of the cosmic world of Prajapati.
- (Data A person who performs a Some sacrifice lasting 12 days, comprising a Dasaha (10): 6 Prethyasadaha + 3 Chandomas (ukthyas) days + 1 Atyagnistoma day; the Dasaha is preceded and followed by 1 Atiratra day (2 days). Dvadasaha is both ahina and a sattra. By performing this sacrifice CP got the title dvadasaha yajî. As he also performed agnicayana in this ritual he got the title agnicit as well.
- A consecrated sacrificer) at the beginning of a Soma sacrifice. It (diksā) takes place after the preliminary isti and ahuti. The proper diksā consists of a series of attitudes and manipulations, adopted and made by the sacrificer, who is provided with a garment, a girdle of munijā grass to be used as a belt, a piece of cloth for his head-dress, a staff and skin of an antelope to sit on.
- 4) 27MIZ A person who performs a Vajapeya sacrifice gets the title Samrat. Vajapeya is "drink of strength or of food", the 6th Samstha of Soma. The Vajapeya incorporates many much popular rites. The number 17 is very much emphasized in the rite.
- to eny caste, as distinguished from a king. He is one of the persons who is Cligible for Madhuparka. This title is offered to a person who offers the Brahaspatisava sacrifice, which is a Some ceremony of one day duration supposed to confer the rank of purphita on the performers. It is considered as an enga of the Vajapeya sacrifice which it follows.
