GLOSSARY

Art criticism - Description, interpretation, and evaluation of art, manifested in journal reviews, books and patronage. Art criticism encompasses a wide variety of approaches, from critical commentary to more subjective emotional reactions inspired by viewing works of art.

Gothic - Style of painting and sculpture that dominated European art from the late 12th century to 16th century. Gothic architecture is characterized by the use of the pointed arch, flying buttresses, soaring clustered columns and the extensive use of stain glass.

Baroque - style in art, architecture and music, which flourished in Europe between 1600 -1750 and were characterized as expressive, flamboyant and decorative schemes, especially using illusionist effects in painting.

Impressionism - movement in painting that originated in France in 1860s and dominated European and North American painting till the late 19th c. Impressionism is classified as being the first of the modern art movements. The emphasis was to achieve greater naturalistic effects by paintings out of doors rather than in the studios.

Expressionism - is a term that is applied to that quality in most works of Indian art today, which are based on emotional values-a deliberate distortion of the rational and traditional methods of representing the subject. This trend towards distortion refers in particular to the outburst of art in the early 20th century Germany.

Surrealism - is a movement in art, literature and films. The surrealists were inspired by thoughts and visions of the subconscious mind. A term coined originally in 1924 to describe art influenced by Freudian theory of liberating the subconscious through dream imagery and the suspension of conscious control.

Tachism - French style of abstract painting followed in the 1940s & 1950s, & the European equivalent to Abstract Expressionism (Dictionary of Arts- Brockhampton Press, London)

Installation - In the west, the installation was an art form that grew quite naturally out of sculpture in the 20th century. It has borrowed elements from the theatre, photography, performance and happening on the one hand and from assemblage and constructivism on the other.

Art for art's sake – A phrase commonly used to describe modern and post-modern art. First employed by C. Baudelaire and T. Gautier to explain that contemporary art needed no social, magical or religious crutch, an artist could express his inner feelings or sense of aesthetics without having to justify them in terms of subject matter or style.
